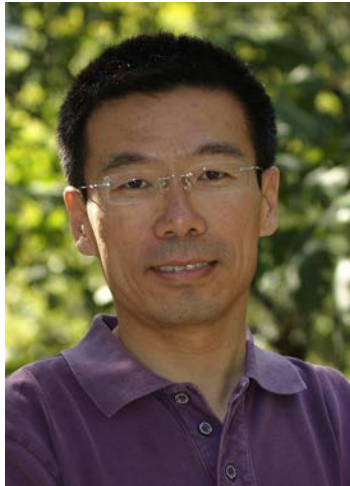


WU Tao



Prof. WU Tao serves as the Interim Dean of Law School of Central University of Finance and Economics (CUFE Law School). Prior to joining CUFE, Professor Wu was a judge at a local court of Hebei Province, 1993-1997.

Prof. Wu's research focuses on competition law. He and his research team in CUFE Law School have been focusing on the issues on IPRs, standards and competition in recent years. Prof. Wu has been a legal adviser for Chinese Ministry of Commerce during the China-US negotiations on Patents and Standards in 2015.

He led a research project of "*Construction of the Legal System of Civil Remedy for Monopoly Behaviors in China*", sponsored by National Social Science Foundation of China and a research project of "*Judicial Issues of Internet Financial Services*", sponsored by the Supreme People's Court. He won the An Zijie Research Grants on International Trade for his academic paper "Trade Conflicts Related to Competition Policy: Micro Analysis on the Necessity of International Coordination of Competition Law".

Prof. Wu has served as legal expert witness in various influential antitrust cases such as the case of Qihu vs. Tencent.

Prof. Wu received a Ph.D. in law from Peking University Law School in 2003. From September 2007-April 2008, Prof. Wu worked on anti-trust law and economics as a visiting scholar at College of Law of University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

Prof. Wu is a member of China Economic Law Society, a member of China Legal Education Society and a member of China Society of WTO Study.
